Creative Project: Meme

Critique: Tuesday, April 7th (Post to the class Tumblr page by **Monday, April 6th)**

This creative project will center on the construction of three memes. As stated in *Keywords in Remix Studies* an internet meme is defined as a:

“hijacking of [an] original idea [but] instead of mutating by random change and spreading by a form of Darwinian selection, they are altered deliberately by human creativity. Unlike with genes (and Dawkins’ original meaning of ‘meme’), there is not attempt at accuracy of copying; internet memes are deliberately altered” (Navas et al. 202).

The project will consist of the production of **three final memes** which will be critiqued by the class and visiting artist, Léon de la Rosa-Carrillo, on Tuesday, April 7th.

Framework for Memes:

Make one of each of these.

1. Social Meme (image and text)

Select an existing meme (meme generator has tons of examples) that you can hijack to comment on a social issue that interests you (COVID-19, LGBTQ+ rights, etc.)

2. Class Content Meme (image and text)

Drawing inspiration from our class readings this semester, create a meme that addresses and extends a given scholar’s philosophies and integrates them into contemporary culture via a meme. Start by selecting a quote from one of the scholars we’ve discussed in class as your source of inspiration. In light of your recent papers, Salman Rushdie, Guy Debord and John Berger all come to mind, but feel free to draw from any of the **scholars or artists** we’ve viewed.

3. Détournement Meme

In the spirit of Léon de la Rosa-Carrillo’s lenticular images/animated gifs that we viewed in class, create an animated gif that plays with the Guy Debord’s notion of détournement. Within this approach the artist transforms the original work/artifact’s meaning through re-contextualization. As Guy Debord states “détournement not only leads to the discovery of new aspects of talent; besides, clashing head-on with all social and legal conventions, it cannot fail to be a powerful cultural weapon” (qtd. in Morgan and Purje). Select a recognizable work of art or cultural artifact (i.e. the *Abbey Road* album cover we reviewed in class). Subvert the original meaning of this work through the omission and/or addition of elements. This meme should take the form of an **animated gif or video meme**. If desired, an overlay of text, may be used but is not required for this option.

- April 2** Meme workshop. **Have your 3 memes posted to Tumblr by April 6th at 7 pm to allow us to review the work prior to class.**
- April 7** **Critique memes virtually in class**
