Creative Project: Remix Video

No matter which option you choose, make sure to make your work concrete and communicative, while also visually evocative. Document the work through video and edit it into a **1.5-2 minute final video**. Make sure the video is in landscape/horizontal orientation. The video will be screened to the class along with your artist's statement. **Ideally, this work_should demonstrate your most polished creative work of the semester.**

Please **select ONE** option for your video project:

Option 1) Mash-up Video

Create a video that explores a socio-political theme, in the spirit of contemporary video artist, Nicole Miller who explores afro-futurism in her work, through varied, layered visuals. It may be helpful to start with a loose concept or even an essay or article on your given topic. You can use that reference to ideate (come up with words that sparks visual creativity). Option 2) COVID-19 Video

How are you individually (or within society at large) dealing with the largest pandemic of our time? What are some personal or individual fears that we're facing due to the situation? Are new ways of communicating emerging? What are the impacts of social distancing? How can contemporary art talk about these challenges and cultural shifts? Option 3) Text and Image: Collaged Video

In the spirit of Barbara Kruger and Ann Hamilton create a video that explores a social or political issue, as defined by Salman Rushdie, about an issue that matters to you. Consider how text and images in your video can be altered, morphed or changed through the making of the video and in turn how this informs the meaning of the work.

Resources: Stop motion animation

Review of Metropolitan Museum of Art Didactic Panel: "Over the last three decades Hamilton has used a wide range of mediums from photography and video installations and performance to explore aspects of the feminine experience grounded in qualities of touch, materiality, and the body. For abc Hamilton wet her fingertip and slowly erased the letters of the alphabet, seen reversed through a sheet of glass. The footage is then run backward so that the amoeba-like form of her fingertip appears to write the sequence from z to a. With exquisite

economy of means and hypnotic simplicity, the artist compounds modes of visual apprehension (linguistic, photographic) in order to dissolve them into the untranslatable realm of touch."
